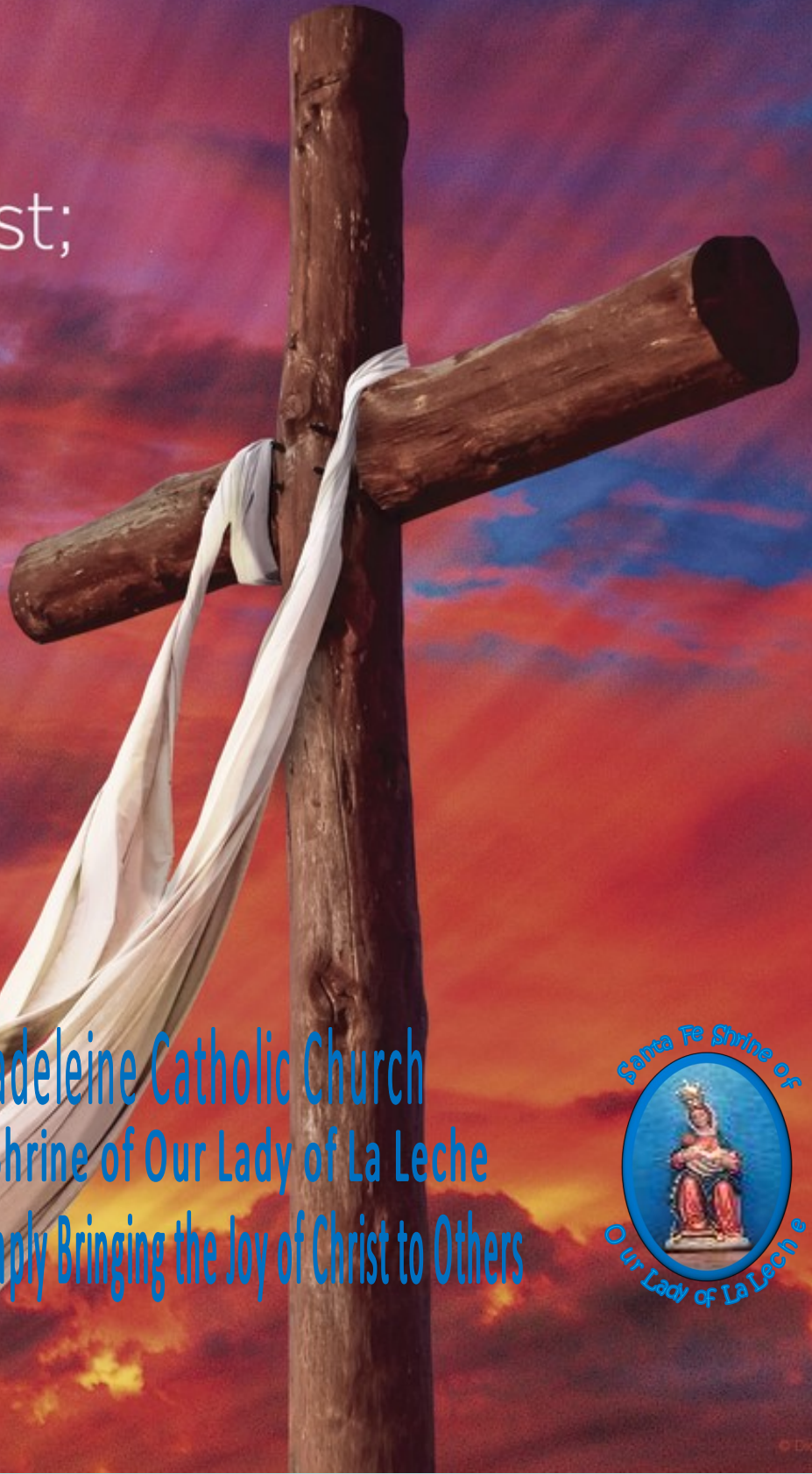

## Guidelines for attending Mass!

Listed below are some things you need to know and guidelines to follow from the Diocese, as you attend Mass:

1. **A general dispensation from Sunday Mass will remain in effect until further notice.** Those who are at most risk of serious infection, as well as their caregivers are encouraged to stay home.
2. **Physical distancing limits seating availability for Mass.** St. Madeleine must abide by restrictions that pertain to physical and social distancing.
3. **Masks or suitable face coverings are required to attend Mass.** To ensure the protection of those around us, the faithful are required to wear a mask or suitable face covering at all times except at the moment of consuming Holy Communion.
4. **Holy Water fonts will remain empty.** The faithful can still make the sign of the cross when entering and exiting the Church to remind yourself of your baptismal vows.
5. **Seating will ensure physical distancing.** Families can sit together, separate families and individuals must sit six feet apart. Ushers will guide you on where to sit.
6. **There is no passing of the basket at Offertory.** Baskets are located at the back of the Church for you to make your donation.
7. **Hand holding during the Lord's Prayer is not permitted.** This non-liturgical practice only increases the chance to spread germs.
8. **The Sign of Peace is also different.** You may bow, or nod to those around you when you are invited to exchange the sign of peace.
9. **Only the Host will be distributed for Communion.** Out of care and concern for ministers, and communicants, the reception of Holy Communion is received in the hand. Mask or face coverings must be worn while moving to or from Communion; however, they are removed to consume the host. Those wishing to receive on the tongue must do so only after all others, and the ushers, have received.
10. **Gloves are not required** to attend Mass but, if they are worn, they must be removed to receive Communion in the hand.
11. **Sunday Hospitality remains closed at this time.**

## Splendor of Truth # 36; Pope St. John Paul II

The modern concern for the claims of autonomy has not failed to exercise an influence on *Catholic moral theology*. While *Catholic moral theology* has certainly never attempted to set human freedom against Divine Law, or to question the existence of an ultimate religious foundation for moral norms, it has, nonetheless, led to a profound rethinking about the role of reason and faith in identifying moral norms.

In response to the Second Vatican Council, there has been a desire to foster dialogue with our modern culture, emphasizing the rational character of moral norms belonging to the natural moral law. There has also been an attempt to reaffirm the ethical requirements of that law which is acknowledged by human reason and personal conscience.

Some people, however, disregarding the dependence of human reason on Divine Wisdom, and the need for Divine Revelation as a means for knowing moral truths, have actually assumed a complete sovereignty of reason over moral norms. Such norms constitute the boundaries for a merely "human" morality; they would be the expression of a law which man lays down for himself and which has its source exclusively in human reason. In no way could God be considered the Author of this law.....These trends of thought have led to a denial of the fact that the natural moral law has God as its author, and that man, by the use of reason, participates in the eternal law, but which is not for him to establish.

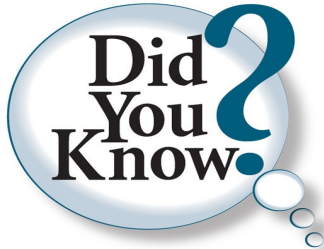

# FAITH & TRADITION:

## A Picture is Worth a Thousand Words

In the 1930's, Jesus reached out to mankind through revelations to Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska. The messages she received were compiled into one volume entitled Divine Mercy in My Soul: The Diary of Sister Marie Faustina Kowalska.



Jesus requested that St. Faustina have an image struck. He said, *"Paint an image according to the pattern you see...I desire that this image be venerated....throughout the world. I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish. I also promise victory over enemies already here on earth, especially at the hour of death."* (Diary entry 47-48).

In this new image, red and white rays flow downward from Jesus's heart and seem to project out to all of mankind. The rays represent the blood and water which gushed forth from Jesus' side on Calvary (Jn. 19:34-35). Under His feet, the words *"Jesus I trust in You"* are inscribed. Catholics around the world recognize this as the image of Divine Mercy.

One might ask why is it necessary to focus on Divine Mercy? Jesus told St. Faustina that He would grant many graces to souls who would venerate His image for it is a "true sacramental" from which flows channels of grace. It not only reminds us that Christ's greatest attribute is mercy, but that we, who are unworthy recipients of it, are obliged to extend it to others. *"I demand from you, deeds of mercy, which*

*are to arise out of love for Me. You are to show mercy to your neighbors always & everywhere."* (Diary entry 742)

Undoubtedly the Divine Mercy is one of the most well-known Christian images today. To the faithful who gaze upon Jesus's face, it begins to fulfill an inmost desire to be united to Him and it provides a small glimpse and a foretaste of heaven.



The red and white rays beckon us to a deeper relationship with Christ. Jesus said, *"The pale ray stands for the water that makes souls righteous. The red ray stands for the Blood which is the life of souls....These two rays issued forth from the very depths of My tender mercy when my agonized Heart was opened by a lance on the cross"* (Diary entry 299). The words *"Jesus I trust in You,"* express the faith we have in His mercy especially at the hour of our death!

In fourteen of the revelations to St. Faustina, Jesus also spoke of the importance of dedicating a special feast day to recognize His mercy. Entry 699 from the

Diary states: *"I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and a shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day, the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day are opened all the divine floodgates through which graces flow. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind... will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity."*

In 1995, Saint John Paul II stated in a papal address that the second Sunday in the Octave of Easter is a day of *"thanksgiving for the goodness God has shown to man in the whole Easter mystery."*



Five years later he proclaimed that the Sunday after Easter would be officially recognized in the Roman Missal as Divine Mercy Sunday. **The Novena of Divine Mercy begins on Good Friday. Nine days later, on April 11, our parish will celebrate the Feast of Divine Mercy from 2:30-3:30 pm in the church. Please join in this celebration of love!**

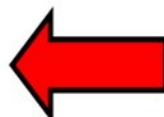
