Guidelines for attending Mass!

Listed below are some things you need to know and guidelines to follow from the Diocese, as you attend Mass:

1. **A general dispensation from Sunday Mass will remain in effect until further notice.** Those who are at most risk of serious infection, as well as their caregivers are encouraged to stay home.
2. **Physical distancing limits seating availability for Mass.** St. Madeleine must abide by restrictions that pertain to physical and social distancing.
3. **Masks or suitable face coverings are required to attend Mass.** To ensure the protection of those around us, the faithful are required to wear a mask or suitable face covering at all times except at the moment of consuming Holy Communion.
4. **Holy Water fonts will remain empty.** The faithful can still make the sign of the cross when entering and exiting the Church to remind yourself of your baptismal vows.
5. **Seating will ensure physical distancing.** Families can sit together, separate families and individuals must sit six feet apart. Ushers will guide you on where to sit.
6. **There is no passing of the basket at Offertory.** Baskets are located at the back of the Church for you to make your donation.
7. **Hand holding during the Lord's Prayer is not permitted.** This non-liturgical practice only increases the chance to spread germs.
8. **The Sign of Peace is also different.** You may bow, or nod to those around you when you are invited to exchange the sign of peace.
9. **Only the Host will be distributed for Communion.** Out of care and concern for ministers, and communicants, the reception of Holy Communion is received in the hand. Mask or face coverings must be worn while moving to or from Communion; however, they are removed to consume the host. Those wishing to receive on the tongue must do so only after all others, and the ushers, have received.
10. **Gloves are not required** to attend Mass but, if they are worn, they must be removed to receive Communion in the hand.
11. **Sunday Hospitality remains closed at this time.**

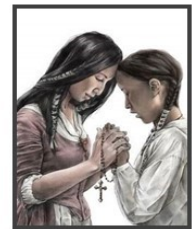

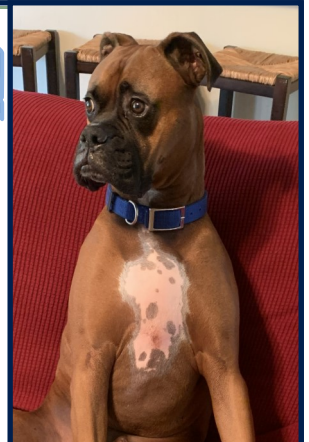

Splendor of Truth # 39 Pope Saint John Paul II



Not only the world, however, but also man himself has been entrusted to his own care and responsibility. God left man "in the power of his own counsel" (Sir 15:14), that he might seek his Creator and freely attain perfection. Attaining such perfection means **personally building up that perfection in himself**. Indeed, just as man in exercising his dominion over the world shapes it in accordance with his own intelligence and will, so too in performing morally good acts, man strengthens, develops, and consolidates within himself his likeness to God.

Even so, the [Vatican] Council warns against a false concept of the autonomy of earthly realities, one which would maintain that "created things are not dependent on God and that man can use them without reference to their Creator". With regard to man himself, such a concept of autonomy produces particularly baneful effects, and eventually leads to atheism: **"Without its Creator, the creature simply disappears....If God is ignored the creature itself is impoverished"**.

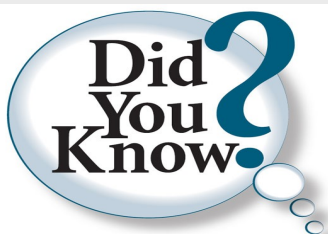

FAITH IN TRADITION: St. Joseph Patron of the Universal Church

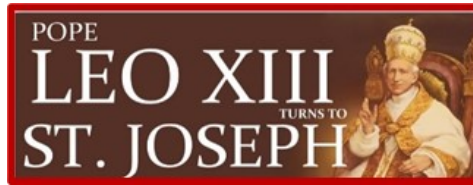
On December 8, 2020, Pope Francis, proclaimed 2021 to be the Holy Year of St. Joseph. In his apostolic letter *Patris Corde (With a Father's Heart)*, the pope called upon all Catholics to rejoice as we celebrate the 150th anniversary of entrusting the faithful to St. Joseph under the title "Patron of the Universal Church." Pope Francis wrote, "Each of us can discover in Joseph, the man who goes unnoticed, a daily discreet and hidden presence, an intercessor, a support and a guide in times of trouble. St. Joseph reminds us that those who appear hidden or in the shadows can play an incomparable role in the history of salvation."

During this year, a special plenary indulgence will be granted under the usual conditions (communion, confession and praying for the pope). In addition, it can be granted to those who perform a work of mercy or meditate on the Lord's Prayer for 30 minutes or participate in a retreat of at least 1 day which has a meditation on St. Joseph. It is fitting, at this time, that we revisit what past popes have written about St. Joseph.

In 1870, Pope Pius IX, in his decree *Quemadmodum Deus*, was the first to bestow the title "Patron of the Universal Church" to St. Joseph.

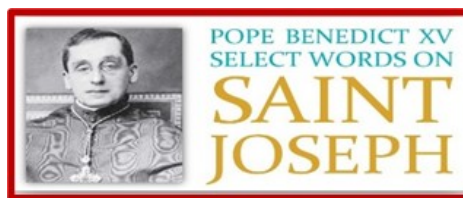


The pope wrote: "On account of this sublime dignity which God conferred on His most faithful Servant, the Church has always most highly honored and lauded the Most Blessed Joseph next after his spouse, the Virgin Mother of God, and has implored his intercession in all her great necessities." Moreover, Pope Pius declared March 19th to be officially recognized by the Church as the feast day of St. Joseph.



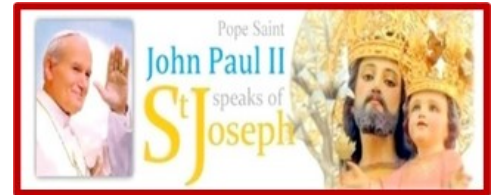
In 1889, Pope Leo XIII wrote an encyclical, *Quamquam Pluries*, on the devotion to St. Joseph. In it, the pope wrote, "During periods of stress and trial – chiefly when every lawlessness of act seems permitted to the powers of darkness – it has been the custom in the Church to plead with special fervor and perseverance to God... by recourse to the intercession of the saints [like St. Joseph]. We see faith, the root of all the Christian virtues, lessening in many souls; we see charity growing cold; the young generation daily growing in depravity of morals and views; the Church of Jesus Christ attacked on every side, and the foundation of religion undermined.... We judge it of deep utility for the Christian people, to continually invoke with piety and trust, together with the Virgin-Mother of God, her chaste spouse, the Blessed Joseph."

In 1920, Pope Benedict XV wrote *Bonum Sane*, commemorating the 50th Anniversary of St. Joseph's title "Patron of the Church".



Benedict decried the condition of society with rising tide of socialism. He wrote, "We, therefore, most concerned by the course of these events, did not neglect to remind the men of our side, how many they are and everywhere, who earn their living with work, to keep them immune from the contagion of socialism, the bitter enemy of Christian principles. We with great solicitude offer them in a particular way St.

Joseph, so that they follow him as their special guide and honor him as the heavenly patron."



In 1989, Pope Saint John Paul II, wrote an apostolic exhortation, *Redemptoris Custos*, on the person and mission of Saint Joseph in the Life of Christ and of the Church. He said, "In this great undertaking, which is the renewal of all things in Christ, marriage – it too purified and renewed – becomes a new reality, a sacrament of the New Covenant. We see that at the beginning of the New Testament, as at the beginning of the Old, there is a married couple. But whereas Adam and Eve were the source of evil which was unleashed on the world, Joseph and Mary are the summit from which holiness spreads all over the earth. The Savior began the work of salvation by this virginal and holy union, wherein is manifested his all-powerful will to purify and sanctify the family – that sanctuary of love and cradle of life."

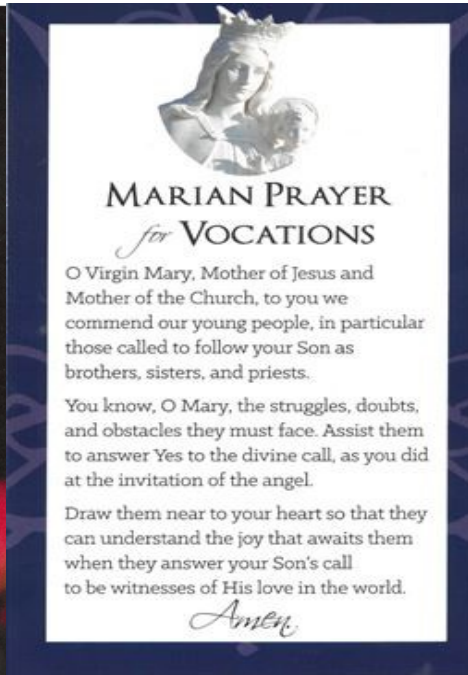
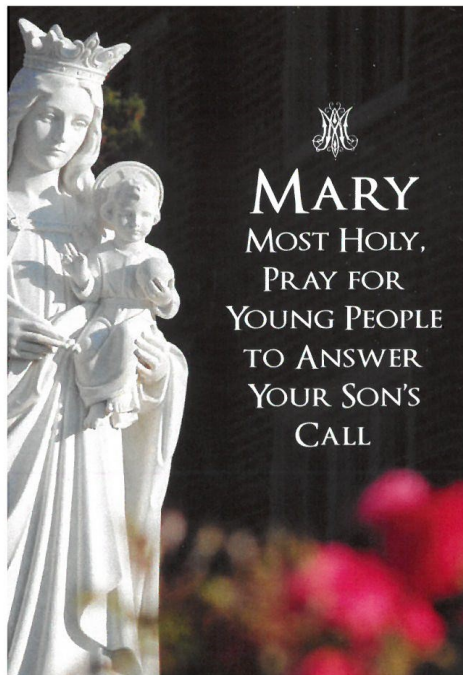
A Prayer for Priests

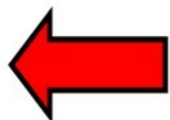
