Guidelines for attending Mass!

Listed below are some things you need to know and guidelines to follow from the Diocese, as you attend Mass:

1. **A general dispensation from Sunday Mass will remain in effect until further notice.** Those who are at most risk of serious infection, as well as their caregivers are encouraged to stay home.
2. **Physical distancing limits seating availability for Mass.** St. Madeleine must abide by restrictions that pertain to physical and social distancing.
3. **Masks or suitable face coverings are required to attend Mass.** To ensure the protection of those around us, the faithful are required to wear a mask or suitable face covering at all times except at the moment of consuming Holy Communion.
4. **Holy Water fonts will remain empty.** The faithful can still make the sign of the cross when entering and exiting the Church to remind yourself of your baptismal vows.
5. **Seating will ensure physical distancing.** Families can sit together, separate families and individuals must sit six feet apart. Ushers will guide you on where to sit.
6. **There is no passing of the basket at Offertory.** Baskets are located at the back of the Church for you to make your donation.
7. **Hand holding during the Lord's Prayer is not permitted.** This non-liturgical practice only increases the chance to spread germs.
8. **The Sign of Peace is also different.** You may bow, or nod to those around you when you are invited to exchange the sign of peace.
9. **Only the Host will be distributed for Communion.** Out of care and concern for ministers, and communicants, the reception of Holy Communion is received in the hand. Mask or face coverings must be worn while moving to or from Communion; however, they are removed to consume the host. Those wishing to receive on the tongue must do so only after all others, and the ushers, have received.
10. **Gloves are not required** to attend Mass but, if they are worn, they must be removed to receive Communion in the hand.
11. **Sunday Hospitality remains closed at this time.**

Splendor of Truth #42 St. Pope John Paul II

"Blessed is the man who takes delight in the Lord." (Ps 1:1-2)

Patterned on God's freedom, man's freedom is not negated by his obedience to the Divine Law; indeed, only through this obedience does it abide in the Truth and conform to human dignity. This is clearly stated by the [Vatican] Council. "Human dignity requires man to act through conscious and free choice, as motivated and prompted from within, and not through blind internal impulse or merely external pressure. Man achieves such dignity when he frees himself from all subservience to his feelings, and in a free choice of the good, pursues his own end by the appropriate means."

In his journey towards God, man must freely do good and avoid evil. But in order to accomplish this he must be able to distinguish good from evil. And this takes place above all *thanks to the light of natural reason*, the reflection in man of the splendor of God's countenance. Thus Saint Thomas, commenting on a verse from Psalm 4 writes: "The light of your face, Lord, is signed upon us, thereby implying that the light of natural reason whereby we discern good from evil, which is the function of the natural law, is nothing else but an imprint on us of the Divine Light". It also becomes clear why this is called the natural law: it receives this name not because it refers to the nature of irrational beings [animals], but because the reason which it promotes is proper to human nature."

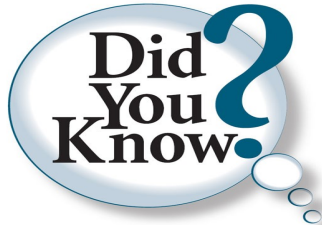

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

First, I want to express my heartfelt appreciation to all the faithful of the diocese for bearing up patiently and prayerfully through a very challenging time in the history of our diocese. All of us have lost friends and loved ones due to COVID-19, and I continue to keep you and your families in my prayers.

Extraordinary times have been met with extraordinary measures, and I am most grateful for the truly creative ways our parishes have stayed connected with parishioners and provided access to the sacraments. With the Lord's help, we have seen our way through the pandemic, calling on the resourcefulness, courage and patience of our clergy, pastoral staff and parishioners, always with the goal in mind that our churches and other public gathering spaces are safe.

As we move forward, I announce that the general dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation for Catholics in the Diocese of St. Augustine will expire on the Vigil of Pentecost, Saturday, May 22, 2021.

There will remain some dispensations for the faithful who may find themselves in specific circumstances. Details about these particular dispensations are attached and can also be found on the diocesan website (www.dosafl.org/coronavirus) and through diocesan social media channels. By announcing the change in dispensations now, parishes will have time to make the necessary adaptations to welcome more members of the faithful to the Sunday Masses.

One of the success stories of the pandemic has been the large number of people who have already been vaccinated against the disease. We expect many more in the weeks ahead. It is also remarkable that since June 2020, most Floridians have been able to safely go about their business, including dining in restaurants, shopping and connecting with family and friends. It would seem reasonable then to strive for the faithful's full and active participation once again at Mass. Since every parish is unique, pastors will need to make individual decisions about safely accommodating an increased number of attendees at Mass (for example, adding additional Masses or identifying a section of pews for those comfortable with less restrictive distancing between persons).

The use of face coverings should be continued until public health guidance suggests otherwise. With guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and other public health agencies, we have learned much about the disease and how it spreads. It appears that close contact with infected persons poses the most significant risk. Contagion from other sources has proven negligible and is preventable by good personal hygiene, social distancing, and face coverings.

The pandemic has meant a huge imposition on normal life. It will likely take more time before we return to some semblance of "normal." As we do so, I would ask all the faithful to continue cooperating with our safety guidelines.

May the Lord continue to bless you richly throughout the Easter season and the months ahead.

FAITH IN TRADITION: St. Joseph the Worker – An Enemy of Communism & Socialism

During the First World War, Pope Benedict XV issued a moto proprio (1920) entitled *Bonum Sane* (translation - A Good and Healthy Thing). A moto proprio is an official proclamation, initiated by a pope, because of his special interest in a particular matter. Pope Benedict was genuinely concerned with the dechristianization of society. *Bonum Sane* was written to explicitly counteract the rising tide of communism in Europe by promoting the veneration of St. Joseph, the patron saint against socialism and the concept of a world government or universal republic. This socialist dictatorship theory today is commonly called the one-world order.



“An idea has emerged of a certain universal republic to come, founded on the absolute equality of men and on the communion of goods, in which there would no longer be any distinctions of nationality, and in which is recognized neither the authority of the father over his children, nor the public authority over the citizens, nor the authority of God over men..... We [the Church], therefore, are concerned most of all by the course of these events... Remind those on our side, who earn their bread by their work, to save themselves from **socialism, the sworn enemy of Christian principles.** With great solicitude we

recommend them in particular to St. Joseph, to follow him as their guide and to receive the special honor of his heavenly patronage....Let the poor then, if they would be wise, trust not to the promises of radical men, but rather to the example and patronage of Blessed Joseph.”

His successor, Pope Pius XI, was also concerned about the effects of communism on society and the Church. The pope realized that communism was constantly moving towards a **classless society which has no room for God, and which would inevitably lead to atheism.** In March 1937, Pius released an anti-communist encyclical entitled *Divini Redemptoris* (Divine Redeemer). In the encyclical, the pope explained that Communism is spreading rapidly around the world because of three reasons: (1) few people understand the true nature of communism, (2) the communist propaganda machine, which is responsible for disseminating error around the world, is controlled at a central location and is absolutely diabolical and (3) the non-Catholic world press is mostly silent about the perils of communism and socialism in society.

The pope wrote: “Communism strips man of his liberty, robs human personality of all its dignity, and removes all the moral restraints that check the burst of blind impulses. There is no recognition of any rights of the individual in relation to others. Communists hold the principle of absolute equality, rejecting all hierarchy and divinely constituted authority, including the authority of parents. Nor is the individual granted any property rights over material goods or the means of production, for these are the source of more wealth and would give one man, power over another.”

The pope continued, “To hasten the advent of the ‘peace of Christ’ in the kingdom of Christ so ardently desired by all, we place the vast campaign of the Church against world communism under the standard of St. Joseph her mighty protector.”



In 1904, a worldwide organization consisting of communist and socialist parties established May 1st as “International Worker Day.” To counteract this, another pope, Pius XII proclaimed May 1st as the Feast of St. Joseph the Worker. The pope hoped that this declaration would help to curtail the spread of communism in the world.

Despite the perceived end of the Cold War in 1991, the propagation of the godless ideas of socialism and communism remain a threat to Christians around the world today. To counter these attacks, we must pray to St. Joseph and be ever vigilant against the constant attempts of incursion of these atheistic beliefs into our Church and our nation!

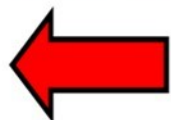
