Guidelines for attending Mass!

Listed below are some things you need to know and guidelines to follow from the Diocese, as you attend Mass:

1. **A general dispensation from Sunday Mass will remain in effect until further notice.** Those who are at most risk of serious infection, as well as their caregivers are encouraged to stay home.
2. **Physical distancing limits seating availability for Mass.** St. Madeleine must abide by restrictions that pertain to physical and social distancing.
3. **Masks or suitable face coverings are required to attend Mass.** To ensure the protection of those around us, the faithful are required to wear a mask or suitable face covering at all times except at the moment of consuming Holy Communion.
4. **Holy Water fonts will remain empty.** The faithful can still make the sign of the cross when entering and exiting the Church to remind yourself of your baptismal vows.
5. **Seating will ensure physical distancing.** Families can sit together, separate families and individuals must sit six feet apart. Ushers will guide you on where to sit.
6. **There is no passing of the basket at Offertory.** Baskets are located at the back of the Church for you to make your donation.
7. **Hand holding during the Lord's Prayer is not permitted.** This non-liturgical practice only increases the chance to spread germs.
8. **The Sign of Peace is also different.** You may bow, or nod to those around you when you are invited to exchange the sign of peace.
9. **Only the Host will be distributed for Communion.** Out of care and concern for ministers, and communicants, the reception of Holy Communion is received in the hand. Mask or face coverings must be worn while moving to or from Communion; however, they are removed to consume the host. Those wishing to receive on the tongue must do so only after all others, and the ushers, have received.
10. **Gloves are not required** to attend Mass but, if they are worn, they must be removed to receive Communion in the hand.
11. **Sunday Hospitality remains closed at this time.**

CPR/AED Training!



On Thursday, January 14th, volunteers gathered in Fr. Sebastian Hall to be trained to respond in an emergency. Volunteers received their CPR certification as well as learning how to use the new AED's (Automated External Defibrillators) that have been installed in the Church, Shrine, and Fr. Sebastian Hall. These devices can be used in

an emergency to assist with the recovery of individuals who have had a heart arrhythmia, or cardiac arrest. They will be used by trained volunteers should the need arise until first responders arrive on the scene.

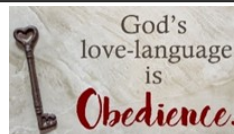

Jesus interpreting the Mosaic Law on marriage, rejects the right to divorce, appealing to a "beginning" more fundamental and more authoritative than the Law of Moses: God's original plan for mankind. "For your hardness of heart Moses allowed you to divorce your wives, but from the beginning it was not so". Jesus' appeal to the "beginning" dismays the disciples, who remark: "If such is the case of a man with his wife, it is not expedient to marry". And Jesus, referring specifically to the charism of celibacy for the Kingdom of Heaven, indicates the new and surprising possibility opened up to many by God's grace. He said to them: "Not everyone can accept this saying, but only those to whom it is given" (Mt. 19: 8 -11).

To imitate and live out the love of Christ is not possible for man by his own strength alone. He becomes capable of this love only by virtue of a gift received. As the Lord Jesus receives the love of his Father, so he in turn freely communicates that love to his disciples: "As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you: abide in my love" (Jn 15:9). Saint Augustine asks: "Does love bring about the keeping of the commandments, or does the keeping of the commandments bring about love?" And he answers: "But who can doubt that love comes first? For the one who does not love has no reason for keeping the commandments".

Living the Gospel Message



There is a certain urgency in today's Gospel as Jesus calls His first disciples—Andrew and Simon, James and John. Each one follows Jesus immediately, unhesitatingly abandoning nets and boats and father and fellow-workers. To what is Jesus calling me— at this moment, in these circumstances? What will I need to abandon in order to follow Him?

Stewardship Reflection on Lectionary Readings — Homily Guide

January 24, 2021 — Third Sunday of Ordinary Time

Jon 3:1-5, 10; PS 25:4-5, 6-7, 8-9; 1 COR 7:29-31; MK 1:14-20

Our readings **today** call us to be decisive in our faith. God calls us as stewards to repent and renew our commitment to Him each day.

In our First Reading, God instructs the prophet Jonah to travel through the city of Nineveh and warns the people that the city would be destroyed due to their evil ways. When the people of Nineveh heard this, they declared a fast in repentance. The Lord saw this and had compassion for them.

Every moment is an opportunity to either grow closer to God or further away from Him. We can identify with the people of Nineveh when we recognize that our actions are not drawing us closer to God. We may be attached to certain sins or living in complacency — over time, that can weaken our commitment to the Lord and sever the relationship we have with Him.

When we become aware of our weaknesses, it should not cause us to despair. Instead, it should call us to act quickly as the people of Nineveh did. Jonah had been gone only a single day's walk before the people repented. We, too, should go no more than a single day

without acknowledging our offenses towards God and renewing our commitment to Him with greater conviction. God wants to be compassionate towards us, but we must be willing to recognize our need to repent.

Our Gospel **today** shares Mark's account of Jesus calling His first disciples. In his account, Jesus approaches Simon and Andrew, and later, James and John. These four men were fishermen, casting their nets. Jesus states, "Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men." In both instances, the men immediately abandoned what was before them and followed Christ.

Imagine if Simon and Andrew looked at their Savior and said, "Thanks for the offer, but we will finish up fishing and meet you later." That is no way a disciple should respond to Christ's call. Yet, that is how we often respond to Jesus' offer to us, "Come after me." We can easily fall into the misconception that we have plenty of time to live active discipleship. We rationalize that we will eventually get around to deepening our commitment to prayer when we have time, even though we have been wanting to do so for months. We can justify that we are too

busy right now to make time to go to confession regularly, but tell ourselves we will do it soon once our schedules ease up. But as faithful stewards of our time, we must change our ways and immediately follow Christ more intentionally, because Christ is calling us to act now, just like the first disciples did.

These men became members of Jesus' twelve apostles. They surrendered their entire lives to follow Christ. They left their jobs, homes and families, devoting their lives to God's work. We, too, are called to surrender our lives to the Lord so that He may work through us. We might think, "God isn't calling me." But indeed, He is. Just as He called four ordinary fishermen, He is continuously calling each one of us. Renewing and reevaluating what God might be asking of us throughout our lives is a key component of our stewardship journey.

As we settle into this New Year, let us ponder the ways we can repent and renew our commitment to God. Let us ask ourselves, what are we casting our nets for? And are we willing to leave it behind for something much greater? If not now, when?

A baby and, indeed, life itself, is

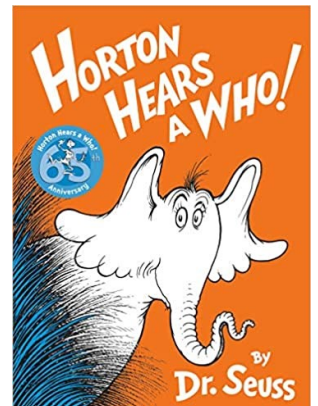

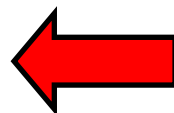
