Guidelines for attending Mass!!!

Listed below are some things you need to know and guidelines to follow from the Diocese, as you attend Mass:

- 1. A general dispensation from Sunday Mass is <u>no longer in effect</u>. Only those who are at most risk, as well as their caregivers, may choose to stay home.
- 2. **Update to mask requirements.** We will no longer require the wearing of masks for fully vaccinated persons, nor will we require proof of vaccination or ask if persons are vaccinated. Those who have not been vaccinated or those who are at highest risk are still encouraged to wear masks.
- 3. **Holy Water fonts will remain empty.** The faithful can still make the sign of the cross when entering and exiting the Church to remind yourself of your baptismal vows.
- 4. **Some seating will ensure physical distancing.** The main portion of the Church will no longer be required to social distance. The south pod (on St. Joseph's side) will continue to be available for those desiring to mask and social distance.
- 5. There is no passing of the basket at Offertory. Baskets are located at the back of the Church for you to make your donation.
- 6. Hand holding during the Lord's Prayer is not permitted. This is a non-liturgical practice.
- 7. **The Sign of Peace.** You may bow, or nod to those around you when you are invited to exchange the sign of peace.
- 8. **Only the Host will be distributed for Communion.** It is encouraged that Holy Communion is received in the hand. Those wishing to receive on the tongue must do so only after all others, and the ushers, have received.
- 9. **Gloves are not required** to attend Mass but, if they are worn, they must be removed to receive Communion in the hand.
- 11. Sunday Hospitality remains closed.

Corpus Christi Procession!

This past Sunday, Catholic Churches all around the world elevated the Precious Body and Blood of our Savior Jesus with a procession. We, at St. Madeleine, joined in this Tradition after 11:30 am Mass. After an important homily by Deacon Cuesta in regards to receiving Our Lord worthily in the Holy Eucharist and a wonderful and reverent Mass celebrated by Fr. Jan, the Blessed Sacrament was then elevated in the Monstrance. All of the Parishioners in the Sanctuary fell to their knees in awe of the beauty of Our Lord in the Monstrance. Altar Servers then processed out



through the Narthex and Portico followed by Fr. Jan carrying Our Lord under a tent being carried by youth in our Parish. We all followed Our Lord and sung songs to Him as we processed out to Our Lady's Grotto. At the Grotto, we again fell to our knees in awe of Our Lord while reciting the Litany of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist. After reciting the Litany of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist, we then



followed Our Lord singing more songs Him while walking back to the coolness of the Sanctuary. The procession ended Benediction and Divine Praises in the Sanctuary. Thank you to all who made this event possible.

Splendor of Truth #51 St. John Paul II

The alleged conflict between freedom and nature has repercussions on



the interpretation of certain aspects of the natural law, especially its universality and immutability. "Where then are these rules written", St. Augustine wondered, "except in the book of that light which is called truth? From thence every just law is transcribed and transferred to the heart of the man who works for justice...Precisely because of this "truth," the natural law involves universality. Inasmuch as it is inscribed in the rational nature of the person, it makes itself felt to all beings endowed with reason. In order to perfect himself, the person must do good and avoid evil, be concerned for the transmission and preservation of life, refine, and develop the riches of the material world, cultivate social life, seek truth, practice good and contemplate beauty.

Inasmuch as the natural law expresses the dignity of the human person and lays the foundation for his fundamental rights and duties, it is universal in its precepts and its authority extends to all mankind. universality does not ignore the individuality of human beings; nor is it opposed to the absolute uniqueness of each person. On the contrary, it embraces each of the person's free acts, which are meant to bear witness to the universality of the true good...By submitting to the common law, our acts build up the true communion of persons. When they disregard the law or are merely ignorant of it....our acts damage the communion of persons, to the detriment of each.



The Beatitiudes serve the purpose of making us "partakers of the divine nature" and, consequently, of eternal life. We are able to enter into and enjoy the glory of Christ through our participation in the interior life of the Trinity. By learning how to know, love, and serve God in this world we will come to the paradise that He wills for us. (CCC#1721)



Helping Households Connect During the Pandemic

The Federal Communications Commission has launched a temporary program to help families and households struggling to afford Internet service during the COVID-19 pandemic. The Emergency Broadband Benefit provides a discount of up to \$50 per month toward broadband service for eligible households and up to \$75 per month for households on qualifying Tribal lands.

Eligible households can also receive a one-time discount of up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from participating providers. Eligible households can enroll through a participating broadband provider or directly with the Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC) using an online or mail in application.
